EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

Mission Hills Condominium Association has three basic categories of activities that are held at or occur in the Clubhouse.

1. **Mission Hills Booster Club:** The Booster Club is a non-profit organization headed by its own board consisting of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Member-at-Large and an Immediate Past President. The club has its own specific by-Laws, which are posted on their bulletin board in the Clubhouse and also on the Mission Hills website.

The Booster Club is the ONLY entity permitted to conduct events that require payment, be it in terms of cash, tickets, collections, or donations. NO OTHER GROUP can conduct an event requiring any type of financial payment (with the only exception is the Mission Hills Dance Committee).

The Booster Club conducts monthly lunches or dinners, seasonal breakfasts, bingo, and other events as approved by the Booster Club members.

2. Other Categories:

Dance Committee: The Mission Hills Dance Committee produces approximately four to six dances per year and sells tickets, which cover the costs of the productions.

Documents Committee: The Mission Hills Documents Committee meets monthly at a specific time and placed announced in the Mission Hills Post. All residents are invited to attend the meetings to audit the processes regarding all issues pertaining to the Mission Hills written documents, including all of the Policies and Procedures put forth by the Board of Directors from time to time. New members are always welcome.

Neighborhood Watch: The Mission Hills Neighborhood Watch meets monthly and all residents are invited to attend. Volunteers are always welcome. The meeting times and dates are posted in the Mission Hills Post.

3. Mission Hills boasts approximately 13 different non-fundraising activity groups. These groups range from organized card games, dominoes, shuffleboard, etc. The purpose of these groups is to foster good relations between neighbors and are a social benefit to all residents. These groups meet weekly, monthly, or seasonally. Most of the meeting dates/times/ locations can be found in the Mission Hills Post.
