

LAW OF THE LAND

MISSION HILLS CONDOMINUM ASSOCIATION POLICY AND PROCEDURES MOTORCYCLES

POLICY: It is the policy and rule of long standing not to allow motorcycles in the Mission Hills complex. See Article XVII in the documents, which prohibits motorcycles on Mission Hills property.

PURPOSE: It is the purpose of this Policy and Procedure to reiterate the existing rule and review the current practice, enforcement and exceptions that had been made by a previous Board to accommodate individuals who have motorcycles. This will guarantee the courtesy extended to those motorcycle owners of record as of this date.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. After the effective date below, the Board will not approve any applicant for residency who intends to bring a motorcycle onto the property.
- 2. No motorcycles will be allowed to be ridden or parked on the Mission Hills property except as designated in the parking area in the front of the property for visitors and those residents already grandfathered in from a previous Board.
- 3. Those residents grandfathered in must register their motorcycle with the office in the clubhouse and sign the registration as acknowledgment that they have read and understand the rules.
- 4. Any violation of the rule or failure to register the motorcycle will subject the vehicle to be towed from the property at the owner's expense.
- 5. Mission Hills does not wish to be known as a motorcycle community and, as such, the members of the Board and that of the Management Company have a duty and responsibility to enforce this rule except as noted above.

Effective date: December 16, 2015

CHEESY BAKED DIP




Now we know why Mission Hills is called Paradise. It's because there are so many angels living here!




