t has been a few rough weeks here at Mission Hills regarding your safety. As of this writing, we have had a car and a bike stolen and a car broken into. It is very important that you check your cars and be sure that they are locked every night. All bikes should be in your shed, condo or locked and attached to a safe spot outside.

Many condos do not keep their outside light on Stowell. Their time and efforts are much apprecithroughout the night. Since most of these break-ins are occurring between 1:30 AM and 3:30 AM, it is important to keep your outside lights on all night. You can purchase outdoor dusk to dawn LED light bulbs that will turn on at dusk and turn off at dawn and do not require a timer or special attachment to your outside light. These lights are available on Amazon, as well as at hardware stores.

Another important thing to know is that if you have an issue or break in, you need to call the police immediately. Your Neighborhood Watch Team can patrol the streets, but we do not do investigations, or make arrests. The Clearwater police are making extra patrols throughout Mission Hills when they can.

LEMON CHICKEN ORZO SOUP

Submitted by Helen J. Strupczewski ◆ Recipe adapted from Aberdeen's Kitchen

COOK TIME: 30 Minutes

SERVES: 6-8

INGREDIENTS:

1 tbsp. Olive Oil

2 Carrots, peeled and diced

1/2 Yellow Onion, diced

3 cloves Garlic, minced

8 cups Chicken Broth

1 cup Orzo Pasta

3 cups Chicken, cooked and shredded

3 Eggs

½ cup Lemon Juice (about 3-4 lemons)

1 cup Fresh Baby Spinach (or frozen *chopped* Spinach)

3 tbsp. Fresh Dill, chopped

Kosher salt and freshly Ground Pepper, to taste

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Heat olive oil in a large stockpot or Dutch oven over medium heat.
- 2. Add carrots and onion and sauté until soft, about 10 minutes. Add garlic and sauté one minute more.
- 3. Add broth and bring to a simmer.
- 4. Add orzo and cook until soft and tender. Stir in cooked chicken and remove from heat.
- 5. Whisk eggs and lemon juice together in a small bowl. Temper your eggs by scooping some of the hot broth from the soup pot and mixing it into the egg mixture.
- 6. Add warmed egg mixture back to the soup pot slowly, stirring constantly, until smooth and creamy.
- 7. Stir in spinach and dill; season to taste with salt and pepper...color with food coloring if desired.




Riders must be able to get in and out of the van without assistance.





