- **As** we approach the end of the year, and two things are for sure: Christmas and the Budget.
- **The Board** will always want the best for our residents and we wish you the best for the holidays.
- **The Budget** is still a work in progress, so please don't elaborate on how much the COAs will be because we don't know. We need the insurance figures which we don't have.
- **Personally**, I don't want Special Assessments and will defend my position until my departure. After that, the new board will make what they feel their fiduciary responsibilities are.
- **As** some of you may already know, I will not seek election next year. We want to reiterate a message we've shared before: **If anyone is interested in running for the board, now is the time to get** involved. Being proactive and engaging with the community helps you understand the challenges and opportunities ahead. Let's aim for a collaborative and successful transition and election process where, hopefully, history will not repeat itself, and **we can all come out as winners.**
- **We** are still recovering from 2 hurricanes and 1 tropical storm so please, be patient. Our crew is working very hard.
- **We** applied for FEMA relief and we were blessed with them picking up the debris and saving us \$6,000.
- **Ron** will be presenting his regular monthly Treasurer's report. We are pleased to report that 2024 has been a successful year in terms of financial planning. Thanks to a strong budget and the ability to keep expenses under control, we have managed to allocate funds to cover some of the storm-related damages. Importantly, this has been achieved without requiring any additional financial contributions from our residents. Our service department has been instrumental in helping and contributing with the board to keep costs down as much as possible. We owe a lot to them. Some of you are very appreciative of them, and we would like to recognize you and thank you all for that.

## FROM THE WELCOME TEAM:

We did not have many residents moving into Mission Hills for the month of October so far and it is understandable after the bad weather we had. We will bring you an update next month with our new residents list.

## COMMUNICATIONS TEAM:

As always, there is a mailbox in the lobby for your questions to the board. Also, you may send emails to any of us as well. All email addresses are on page 2 of the Post.

Most of the questions this month have been regarding debris pickup and roof leaks. Like I said before, our crew is diligently working with roofers, contractors, tree removal companies, plumbers, etc. you name it. They are very busy right now trying to bring Mission Hills back to normal. We have been blessed we didn't have any human casualties during these storms, except for a few condo units. The Crew is working on them, and soon they will be fixed, the homeowners will be able to go back to their homes.

We have a laundry Team and please familiarize yourself with the process posted on the bulletin board and the laundry rooms

Lastly, we have worked with the compliance committee and revised the Compliance rules to better mirror and reflect FS718. we hope we can act more expeditiously with the residents to bring issues to a faster resolution. Final rules are posted on the bulletin board.

As always, for loose animals, noise, and other immediate issues, please call the non-emergency police number. Ameritech will send a letter if you request it but the letter will arrive after the fact. Please act immediately.

# Treasurer's Report

## October Financial Report

For the second month in a row, Expenses exceeded Revenues. Revenues were \$277,874 and Expenses were \$287,683. Year-to-date Revenues \$2,755,865 and Year-to-date Expenses \$2,598,779 making Revenue exceeding Expenses by \$157,086. Delinquencies continue to run high, being \$33,938 this month. Eight accounts are in various stages of collection.

We are projected to be under budget approximately \$256,000 by the end of the year.

Our current Reserves are \$742,824. We have one outstanding loan taken a number of years ago to do roof repair. That loan is due to be paid in full next year. The outstanding balance on that loan is \$117,935.

The maintenance team collects only garbage and recycling and is not responsible for collecting larger items. Note that weeds and plantings may be placed next to the garbage cans and they will be taken care of.

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

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

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
