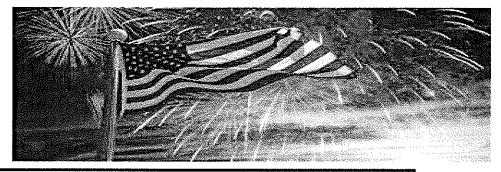

From the President's Desk

Financial future of Mission Hills:

Mission Hills has been navigating a complex financial landscape, balancing between maintaining essential services and addressing deferred maintenance needs. Recent efforts have been focused on reducing unnecessary expenses and avoiding special assessments wherever possible. The board has been working to tighten the budget and ensure financial stability.

<u>Deferred Maintenance</u>: Addressing deferred maintenance has been a significant focus, especially with projects such as trees and roofs. These projects are necessary to prevent future costly damages and ensure the safety and aesthetic appeal of the community.

<u>Operational Costs</u>: Regular operational costs, including utilities, maintenance, and administrative expenses, continue to be a significant part of the budget. The board has been working to keep these costs in check through careful planning and oversight. As of today, we are in a good financial position and we are projecting to finish the year in the same way provided we monitor expenses without jeopardizing quality of life.

<u>COA Fees:</u> The primary source of revenue for Mission Hills comes from condo owners' association (COA) fees. Ensuring timely collection and managing any delinquencies is crucial for maintaining a steady cash flow. When owners fall behind, it affects everyone.

<u>Special Assessments:</u> While this board aimed to avoid special assessments, they may be necessary for significant, unplanned expenses or large-scale projects that exceed the regular budget such as roofs, trees, sewer line, etc. Our roofs are aging and will have to be taken care of in the next coming years. We are being proactive at this time negotiating with several roofing vendors to be able to extend the life of the roofs and be able to manage their replacement in the best financially responsible way to be able to avoid Special Assessments as much as possible.

Aging Infrastructure: The aging infrastructure requires continuous investment in repairs and upgrades. Our maintenance crew is diligent in preserving and protecting the infrastructure. We have replaced wood on units, Carports, and water heaters as it becomes necessary. A lot of progress has been made in this area and it is a constant work in progress.

<u>Community Involvement:</u> Encouraging more resident involvement in committees, Teams, and decision-making processes helps distribute the workload and brings in diverse perspectives, which can lead to more effective financial management.

<u>Conclusion:</u> The financial future of Mission Hills depends on careful management of current resources, proactive planning for future needs, and active engagement from the community. By addressing deferred maintenance, controlling operational costs, and encouraging resident involvement, the board aims to ensure a sustainable and prosperous future for Mission Hills.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report - May 2024

May was another good month, Revenue: \$271,650 - (\$3,266.57 in arrears). Expenses were \$248,917. For the month we were \$22,933 under budget. Year to date we were \$114,505 LINDER budget! Delinquencies are \$24,900. We have one account

we were \$114,505 **UNDER** budget! Delinquencies are \$24,909. We have one account seriously over 90 days. Utilities YTD water and sewer are over budget. Clubhouse Spectrum will receive a discount on a new internet package, an unused cell phone was disconnected creating savings that will show up on July's Financials. Janitorial services were over but will balance out in July as well.

Mission Hills Monthly Maintenance Report by Ken Vasquez, Service Dept. Supervisor

A new tankless water heater was installed on the second breezeway at phase 8. This should complete the heater and hot water issues on that phase. We have discrepancies on how the piping is done; straightening that up would have cost \$11,000. Installing a water heater on each breezeway, we spent about \$7,000 and so far, everyone has hot water, fast!

In Phase 1, we had leaks having to replace a water heater on carport 102 and repair the other water heater on carport 107. The leak was reported, the maintenance department reacted immediately, and the situation was handled promptly.

Finally, we are getting so much needed rain, therefore the lawns now have to be mowed more often. We were doing a lot of woodwork during the drought but now, we are back on the tree business. Palm trees were trimmed throughout the boulevard.

We had roof leaks that were in need of repair. Between our crew and a new roofer, we got it all handled at a very good price.

Wood has been ordered to repair Carports. The Next Carport to be repaired is #17. Carports # 47 and # 50 will be done next.

Some of you might know that Oscar has been promoted to Crew Lead. If you run into him, please congratulate him. He is very familiar with the operation of Mission Hills and is doing a fantastic job.

The maintenance crew has been on top of things (thank you to Oscar) as Ken, the supervisor, organizes remotely as he travels the beautiful USA!

Also bring back the picture from ladies bathroom by the pool.

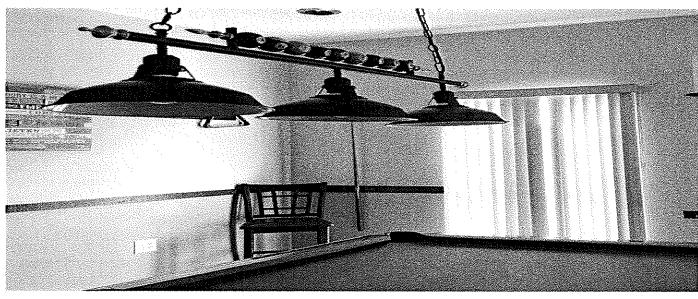
Keep Your Porch Lights On!

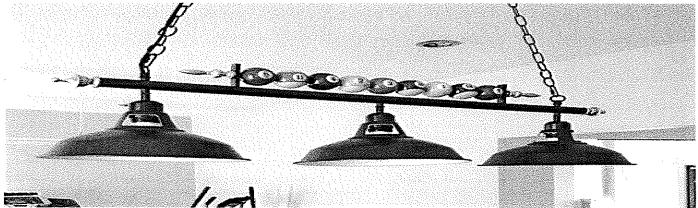

From the Welcome Team:

We would like to welcome our new resident to Mission Hills: John Randisi. If you see him, please welcome him to Mission Hills.

Updates to remember:

As you know, we have a work order process through the website. It is used quite a bit, and we encourage residents to utilize it. It saves you time from going into the office, and requests are handled promptly.

Compliance: We continue with the Mission Hills Beautification project. There are many areas of concern, but you have responded with flying colors. Many of you have reached out to the board seeking advice and, together, we have solved numerous issues. Keep your requests coming.

Why are we asking you to trim your tree touching the roof? The reason is that the wind makes the branches behave like a blade making this an opportunity for slicing the rooftop. Shingle roofs are different, these branches don't affect shingles but do affect flat roofs.

Back patios are not for storage, they are for residents to relax. If you have items that don't belong on a patio, please store them in your shed. We have an opportunity of a shed, but not many communities do.

Some of you reached out to the board for help due to physical constraints, we have resources to help you. You just need to ask, we will be there to help.

Bob walks around taking pictures of what he perceives to be out of compliance, we work together to correct any discrepancies.

HELP WANTED:

We are still looking for neighborhood watch volunteers; it requires only one hour per month.

We need a volunteer to unlock and lock the pool.

We need volunteers to deliver the Post. We have a new resident who volunteered. July will be the last month the Post will be delivered until snowbirds are back in town. Too much waste of unread Posts on people's doors. They will always be delivered electronically, on the website, and will be placed on top of the table in front of Sue's office for you to pick up.

We are looking for a part-time person who can pick up trash and recycle 3 times a week during the summer months. If you or anyone you know is interested in making extra money for the summer, please contact our newly appointed Crew Lead Oscar in the Service Department.

Some housekeeping items.

- Do not park on the grass. We have a high expenditure on irrigation supplies due to this practice.
- We are a NO PET COMMUNITY. Please do not "dog sit" for a friend. Your animal must be registered in the office as either a service animal or emotional support. No other animals or pets are allowed on the property.
- Animals must be walked on a leash and owners must pick up after your animal. We had a lot of reports of animals running loose and their business not being picked up. For your animal's sake, please walk it with a lease. We don't want to lose any animals to the pound.
- Please rinse your body after swimming by the pool shower before using the bathroom shower. It has been very hard to clean due to body oil residue.
- We have received reports of residents cohabitating with more people than allowed by law. If you have guests staying with you, they cannot reside in your condo for more than two weeks without completing a background check for \$40.00. By law, only two people per bedroom are allowed in each unit.
- Mission Hills was built with gardens in both the front and back of the units. Over time, patios were enclosed, and owners converted these garden areas into living patio spaces. This practice is not conducive to the proper absorption and drainage of rainwater. Consequently, additional gutters and rerouting of roof water, along with other means of drainage, became necessary. If you have rainwater buildup in either area, please try to adjust the drainage on your property. If that doesn't resolve the issue, please involve our service crew for further assistance.
- Make sure license plates are current. Several warnings have been issued to some residents.

 A few are driving on the road with expired tags. It is a matter of law, we don't want to tow anyone's car. Thank you for your cooperation

The other entertainment equipment we have available is a pool table/ping pong table converter. We just purchased ping pong balls for your enjoyment; please count them at the end of your game to ensure they are all accounted for.

Please be kind to all the equipment available and after you are done, keep it clean for the next residents' use.

The room is maintained by your C.O.A. and is for the enjoyment of residents and their guests only. Users must be 18 years and older to use the facility and must be accompanied by a resident.

Mission Hills Swimming Pool

The Mission Hills property and pool are private-use facilities for members and their guests. Pool rules are posted in the pool area. Please take the time to read them and always keep safety in mind while at the pool.

Club use is a privilege afforded to all dues-paying members of the Mission Hills Condo Association. All residents should be able to enjoy our clubhouse and pool without having anyone ruining their day. The club property is under 24-hour video surveillance. If you see something, say something. If you observe any suspicious behavior on the property, don't hesitate to get in touch with the property management company, the office during business hours, or the police. Do not engage with violators. Stay safe!

PLEASE DO NOT BRING FOOD OR DRINKS, OR SMOKE IN THE POOL AREA.

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

- ... parking for the two laundromats is to be in the designated parking areas. Please do not park in or block the residents parking spaces.
- ... as you head out for vacation, your water should be turned off and your ac should be on 78 or lower. And since it is hurricane season, if you are leaving for more than a week, you should bring in all of your outdoor plants and furniture. Storms come up fast and we need to keep our neighborhoods safe from flying debris.
- . . . this is a no pet community. All emotional support animals need to be registered in the office. These animals need to always be on a leash and owners must clean up after them.
- ... if you have someone living with you in your condo, they need to be registered in the office.

We always have lots of outsiders wondering through Mission Hills in the summer. Please remember that if you see someone or something suspicious do not hesitate to call the Clearwater Police at 727-562-4242, or 911, if it is an emergency. We patrol the grounds every night but we cannot always catch everything.

A reminder to be sure your car is locked every night and that bikes and other valuables should also be locked up. And, continue to keep those front lights on so those of us on patrol can see what is happening in your front yard. I would say that we are close to having 80% of the community with their lights on. If you do not leave your light on, know that you should for the safety of your neighbors and yourself. Dusk to dawn lights are available for \$5.

And lastly, please remember that the speed limit in Mission Hills is 20 mph! We are noticing a number of people speeding again, especially on the boulevard. SLOW DOWN!
