TREASURER'S REPORT

By Ron Stock, Treasurer

he report for June shows revenues of \$286,683, and expenses of \$360,169, which reflects water heater purchases. Year-todate revenues were \$1,818,615, and expenses were \$1,794,796. We are under budget by \$23,868.

Last month, I incorrectly reported delinquencies of \$64,173. The actual number was \$24,454. This month's total is \$23,432.

Let me explain my error. I receive two numbers each month labeled "2024 delinquencies" and "2025 delinquencies." I incorrectly added them together last month. Technically, the 2025 numbers are not delinquent when I receive the report, because we have a 15-day grace period for COA fees. Last month, nearly \$45.000 in COA fees were received after I received the final numbers for May, but were within the grace period. The delinguencies that should have been reported were \$24,454.



When looking at expenses compared to budget, the gas utility costs are slightly greater than budgeted by \$1,453. Our legal expenses are exceeding the budget by \$7,193, reflecting our efforts to obtain court orders removing two troublemakers from Mission Hills and dealing with a hoarder that is causing a nuisance. Roof Repair and Building Supply and Repair are exceeding the budget by more than \$108,646, again, due to hot water heater purchases.

Last month I reported that 153 had not paid the additional COA fee for January, and I asked you to do so. I can report that one homeowner did make payment. Thank you! That leaves 152 who have not paid the shortage from January. ★

Law of the Land

MISSION HILLS CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION POLICY FOR FUNCTIONS OR ACTIVITIES HELD AT THE CLUBHOUSE

For any function or activity that is not a Booster Club event but is being held at the MHCA Clubhouse and involves the collection of fees, this Policy and Procedure must be followed.

- In the cases of private parties by either a resident or an offsite group, an application for Event Hall Reservation must be completed. This form is available in the Mission Hills office.
- Only the main event hall may be reserved. No other rooms or areas in the Clubhouse, including but not limited to the pool, pool deck, and pool patio, can be reserved or used by any group without a majority vote of the Board of Directors.
- Reservations for the Hall are on a first come, first served basis.
- Guests are prohibited from using any other rooms in the Hall. This includes the library, the game room, and the living room.
- ♦ The event organizer must advise guests regarding parking restrictions; emergency vehicles must have clear access to the Clubhouse.
- Decorations must not deface the property, paint, or walls.
- All decorations, trash, and leftover food must be removed at the end of the event; trash must be placed in the approved receptacle.
- Within 24 hours of the close of the event, the Hall will be inspected to ensure that there are no damages, the kitchen is cleaned, and all tables/chairs are cleaned and placed in their original positions.

BRUNCH HAM ENCHILADAS

(A Facebook recipe submitted by Helen J. Strupczewski)

Ingredients

2 cups Fully Cooked Ham, cubed

½ cup Green Onions, chopped

10 8" Flour Tortillas

2 cups Shredded Cheddar Cheese, divided

1 tbsp. All-Purpose Flour

2 cups Half-and-Half

6 lg. Eggs, lightly beaten

1/4 tsp. Salt, optional



Instructions

- 1. In a large bowl, combine ham and onions; place about ¼ cup down the center of each tortilla.
- 2. Top with 2 tbsp. cheese.
- 3. Roll up and place seam side down in a greased 13x9" baking dish.
- 4. In another large bowl, combine the flour, cream, eggs and, if desired, salt until smooth.
- 5. Pour over tortillas; cover and refrigerate for 8 hours or overnight.
- 6. Remove from the refrigerator 30 minutes before baking.
- 7. Cover and bake at 350° for 25 minutes.
- 8. Uncover: bake for another 10 minutes.
- 9. Sprinkle with remaining cheese; bake 3 minutes longer or until the cheese is melted.
- 10. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving.
