First, I want to express my gratitude to everyone who supported the original board during the grassroots movement for change. Your efforts, hard work, and commitment will always be greatly appreciated and never forgotten. We could not have done it without your help.

Since those early days, we've faced many trials: board member resignations, new appointments, a strained budget that led to difficult personnel decisions, hurricanes, new appointments again, and more. Despite many hurdles, Al and I persevered, working alongside newly appointed volunteer board members like Jack Emerson, Doug Kuchle, and Jone Burr. And now, Ron Stock, Ron Halvorson, and Patty Banning.

A special thanks to Jone Burr for her blackbelt expertise in accounting. Her disciplined financial approach allowed us to establish a solid 2024 budget, coupled with the board's tight control of expenses. These efforts have laid a strong foundation for the present board to build upon and create a forward-thinking budget.

With continued spending discipline, we should be on track to achieve the goal of being fully funded by 2026. However, it will require all of us to remain committed to this objective to ensure its success.

The original board's goal was to craft a budget that would cover all expenses without requiring a special assessment. I feel that this mission has been accomplished.

The reason for my resignation, two months before the upcoming election, is to pave the way for new candidates to step forward and carry on the mission of making Mission Hills a truly great place to live.

I am incredibly proud of what we've achieved together and remain optimistic about the future of Mission Hills. Thank you all for your trust, collaboration, and support during my tenure.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

#### November Financial Report

For the month Revenue exceeded Expenses. Revenues were \$267,161 and Expenses were \$210,728. Year-to-date Revenues are \$3,023,377 and Year-to-date Expenses are \$2,818,506 making Revenue exceeding Expenses by \$204,871. Delinquencies were much improved with our collection efforts down to \$20,118 from last month's 33,938. Four accounts have received notices of our intent to foreclose.

Although we are requesting a vote not to fully fund reserves, we want to reach fully funded soon. We also recognized that many of our residents are on a fixed income with only modest COLA increases. Thus our goal was limiting increases monthly assessments to under 5%.

Getting to fully funded reserves, after many years of not doing so, was unrealistic in one year. We have adopted a three-year plan to get us fully funded. As a first step, with this year's budget we increased reserves by \$100,000 (you can see this on Line 9100 of the proposed 2025 Budget) and, as a second step, we will roll over any sums approved in the adopted 2024 budget that are not spent. This will increase reserves by a substantial amount, perhaps as much as \$200,000 although the final sum has yet to be determined.

Our goal of attaining fully funded reserves without significant monthly assessment increases should be accomplished with the adoption of the 2026 Budget.

We have also had a question on the language of the notice. As a Condominium Association, the monthly payments you make to the Association are called "assessments." the use of this term in the notice of the meeting has confused some residents. No "Special Assessments" are being proposed.

#### POOR MAN'S PRIME RIB

(a Face Book recipe submitted by Helen J. Strupczewski)

This is quick and easy recipe to ring in the New Year in style ... enjoy!!

#### Ingredients

3-pound beef eye of round roast

1 tsp Garlic Powder

1 tsp Onion Powder

Salt and pepper, to taste



#### Directions:

evenly season the roast with garlic powder, onion powder, salt, and pepper to infuse it with rich flavors.

Set your oven to a robust 500 degrees F (260 degrees C). Place the seasoned roast in a baking dish or roasting pan without covering or adding water, ensuring it cooks evenly and browns nicely.

Insert the roast into your sizzling oven, and immediately dial back the temperature to 475 degrees F (245 degrees C). Let it bask in this heat for a calculated 21 minutes, allocating seven minutes per pound to ensure it's beautifully roasted.

After the initial roasting, switch off the oven and allow the roast to dwell in the lingering heat for a substantial 2 1/2 hours. It's critical to retain the heat by keeping the oven door firmly shut throughout this period.

Upon removal, ensure the internal temperature of the roast has achieved at least 145 degrees F (65 degrees C) to guarantee it's adequately cooked and safe for consumption.

Carve your transformed roast into thin, elegant slices, presenting your guests with a meal that's tantalizingly close to the revered prime rib.

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
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


