#### **JELLY'S JAM**

Happy November everyone and welcome back to those folks who have slowly begun trickling in as the colder weather is spreading across the north and the western US and Canada. You know it's getting chilly to the year rounders when we start wearing jeans and sweatshirts, when it is 75 degrees! Hopefully you will notice changes as you make your way back...the grass is much greener (or it was until the recent drought!), the trees have been trimmed, and the crew is beginning the arduous job of trimming over 450 palm trees! A job that is 3 years late being done. The crew has been updating the exteriors of many of the units and paying close attention to becomming expert trimmers and edgers. All of the lights around the shuffle board court have been repaired and the courts are seeing a nightly increase in use...the equipment to play is in the shed and the courts are always free to use! The biggest news perhaps is the extended hours of the pool! Night swimming is now available until 10pm. The insurance company was consulted and we were given the go ahead to add the necessary lighting so please enjoy an evening dip in the water! The temps have been beautiful.

I would also like to mention the laundries are now open until 10pm. We decided locking everything at one time is easier than having someone going back and forth multiple times. The well for the southern portion of Mission Hills has also been completed...thank you to all who put up with the daily tapping as they unexpectedly opened up a new vein. Despite our best intentions and those of the well drillers, the old well was damaged beyond daily use.

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The well will produce water, but not enough to sustain the pressures needed to water the lawns. We had contracted to have that well and pump repaired for \$12,900. The vendor then offered a solution to drill the new well and attach it to the old one, avoiding a capping fee (for the old one), so we basically got a new well for \$17,000 instead of the quoted \$50,000 we received from multiple companies. The irrigation company will be coming this week, and we are hoping to get all the sprinkler systems coordinating and running on schedule. The crew has been locating and uncovering sprinkler heads, so if you have a problem with one, please report it to Lexi in the office and let her know what time it came on so Daran can trace it out!

I am also pleased to report that after 2 very productive budget workshops, the Board found a way to fully fund the reserves, fund a fair and even budget for next year, and not increase monthly fees. Yes, we did make the decision to charge what we consider a small assessment of approximately \$325 per unit, which will not be due until February of 2026, and can even be divided into 3 payments of about \$110 per month. The success of this community depends on the members... I see many new faces as I ride around on my bike, but not many new faces at the fun activities the Booster Club sponsors. Please join in the fun and get to know your neighbors! Also, if you have an activity you'd like to see us offer here, stop in the office or send any Board member an email. We would love to hear your ideas! Next up is the big Thanksgiving Feast, and then The Silly Season will be upon us! Happy November!

For the second month in a row Expenses exceeded Revenues. Revenues were \$268,720 and Expenses were \$286,972. Year to date Revenues are \$2,791,635 and YTD Expenses are \$2,791,342. The Board will try to limit expenditures for the remainder of the year.

Delinquencies continue to rise. To date they amount to \$77,768. An increase of \$7,165 in one month.


#### Volunteers needed for Salvation Army Bell Ringing!
