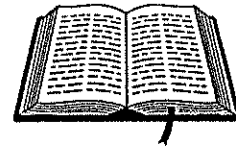

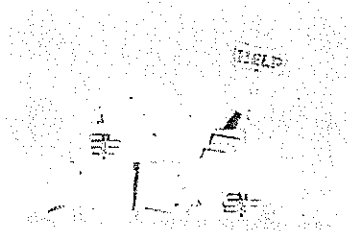

DOCUMENTS COMMITTEE UPDATES
(submitted by the MH Documents Committee)

By now, you have received a memo from the committee discussing the proxy/quorum rules for us to follow in preparation for our annual meeting in March.

In order to assist our residents further, the committee has set up the following times/dates for two Educational Seminars as well as a Help Desk. We have set the times for evenings so that all of our residents will be able to attend. As a reminder, there are updates to the process so please forget whatever you have heard in the past. The committee requests that you bring your proxy/quorum paperwork to the seminars so that we can walk you through the process only.



Here is the schedule for the seminars and help desk:

1. The first will take place on Thursday, January 8th at 7PM in the clubhouse hall ... after the seminar, the committee members will be available to assist residents with their proxy.
2. The second will take place on Thursday, February 12th at 7PM.
3. The Proxy/Quorum Help Desk will be set up as follows:

The first Monday/Tuesday/ Wednesday of March, 2026 .. the times for each day will be 1PM to 3PM and 6PM to 8PM ... this way, residents who still work will also have the opportunity to take part.

We hope that our residents take full advantage of these seminars ... they will certainly help eliminate the confusion of the past.

TREASURERS REPORT



November Treasurer's Report

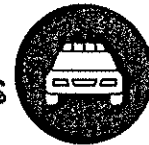
Revenues exceeded expenses in November. Revenues were \$285,462 and Expenses were \$277,566. Year to date Revenues are \$3,601,451 and YTD Expenses are \$3,347,161. Efforts to reduce expenses are working. Delinquencies continue downward. They currently are \$53,538 from last months total of \$58,519.

At the Board Meeting on December 17 we received good news. Our insurance costs for 2026 will cost us \$100,187.18 less than last year. Generally we accept the insurance option to pay in equal monthly installments. Doing this costs us an \$12,603.42 in interest. We do not have the ability to pay in full. Our full cost would be \$421,562 This is more than our current cash balance in our operating account. Because of this we pay in equal monthly payments.

It was suggested that if we have a savings of \$100,000 we could pay more, borrow less, and save some interest. I promised to look into this. Paying the extra amount would only lower the interest expense from \$12,603.42 to \$11,084.95. Having the ability to address some additional improvements throughout the year would appear to be better for owners than the modest savings in interest.

Just a reminder that local schools do not resume classes until January 5 so be aware of those who are still out and about.

Once your holiday decorations come down, please remember to keep your front light on for the safety of your neighbors. We still have a number of people who do not turn them on. We have LED dusk to dawn bulbs available for \$5. These bulbs cost approximately \$1.75 a YEAR in electrical use. Bulbs can be delivered and installed if needed.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .

. . . the speed limit in Mission Hills is 20 mph?

We have a number of residents who bike and walk the streets so we ask that you **SLOW DOWN** and be aware of others.

. . . only garbage should be placed in the green bins in your area?

Any larger items should be taken to the dumpster in the maintenance area and yard clippings should be placed next to the green bins.

. . . we have specs for our front doors? All doors need to be painted the common color (available by bringing a container to maintenance for some paint) and are not to be left white. The only glass that is permitted is at the very top of the door. Specs are available in the office.

FROM THE LAUNDRY TEAM...

Quarters are available in \$10 increments in the lobby the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month.

Our goal is to continue to have a clean facility with all machines in working order. There are two washers which are beyond repair and we will be replacing them in the new year.

We are trying to curb the expensive repair costs and are asking your help when encountering a machine which isn't working properly. **Please take a moment and complete a work order explaining the problem (place in wall file) and place an "out of order" sign on the machine.** During the past month, we've had "out of order" signs on machines, with no explanation. When one of the team members ran machines to find out what was wrong, the machine worked properly. A machine had an "out of order" sign on it, when the beads of a laundry scent booster weren't wiped out.

With your assistance, our goals will be achieved.

Lemon Chicken Orzo Soup

(submitted by Helen J. Strupczewski .. recipe adapted from Aberdeen's Kitchen.)

Serves 6-8; 30 minutes



INGREDIENTS

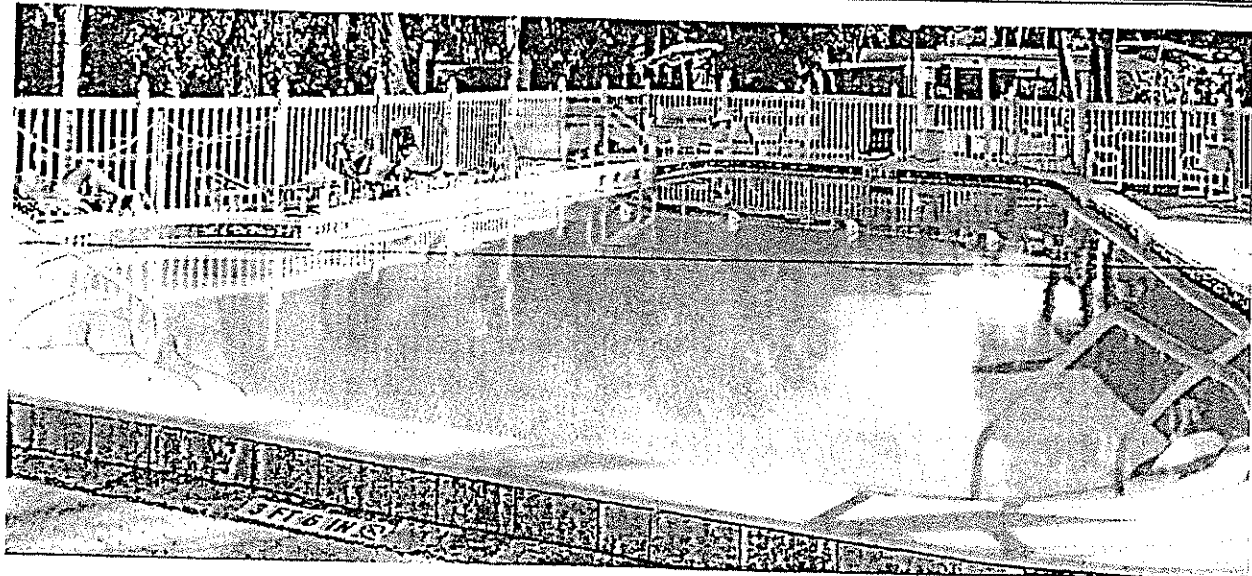
- 1 cup orzo pasta
- 3 cups cooked and shredded chicken
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 cup lemon juice (about 3-4 lemons)
- 1 cup fresh baby spinach (frozen *chopped* spinach)
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste
- 3 tablespoons fresh dill, chopped
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 carrots, peeled and diced
- 1/2 yellow onion, diced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 8 cups chicken broth

PREPARATION

1. Heat olive oil in a large stockpot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Add carrots and onion and sauté until soft, about 10 minutes. Add garlic and sauté one minute more.
2. Add broth and bring to a simmer. Add orzo and cook until soft and tender. Stir in cooked chicken and remove from heat.
3. Whisk eggs and lemon juice together in a small bowl. Temper your eggs by scooping some of the hot broth from the soup pot and mixing it into the egg mixture.
4. Add warmed egg mixture back to the soup pot slowly, stirring constantly, until smooth and creamy.
5. Stir in spinach and dill, season to taste with salt and pepper, and serve! Enjoy.

This is one of our favorites ... so yummy!!
